Generally, in criminal cases, the prosecution is not entitled to discovery from the defense. However, if a case is set for trial, in most jurisdictions the prosecution is entitled to “reciprocal” discovery from the defendant. This may include information regarding the nature of the defense; contact information for any witnesses or experts the defense intends to call at trial, and any written reports prepared by their experts.
