Oenothera caespitosa (Tufted Evening Primrose) is a perennial or biennial boasting charming rosettes of lance-shaped, fuzzy, blue-green leaves, 4 in. long (10 cm). Erect flower buds give way to large, fragrant, white flowers, 2-3 in. wide (5-7 cm), adorned with contrasting yellow stamens.

The tufted evening primrose (*Oenothera caespitosa*) is a perennial plant that blooms from September through April. The flowers are about three inches wide with four white, heart-shaped petals and yellow stamens. The flowers, which are very fragrant, open in late afternoon, close the next morning, and wither to pink or red-violet.
